Language Arts Activities

READING FICTIONAL STORIES

Read the fictional book entitled Loop the Loop by Barbara Dugan. This picture book is intended for children of ages 4-8, but because of its subject matter, can effectively be used by students in grades 1-8. It is the story where the yo-yo becomes the center of a friendship formed between a young girl and an elderly woman who obviously has Alzheimer's Disease.

1. Write an experience that you have had with an older person.

Write a short story about a grandparent.

OR

Write a short story about an activities that you've done with an order person or grandparent.

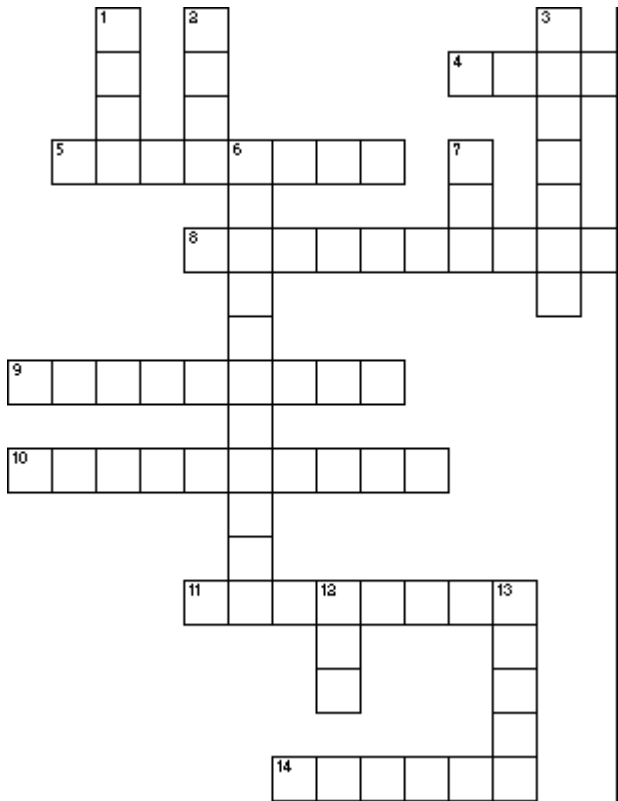

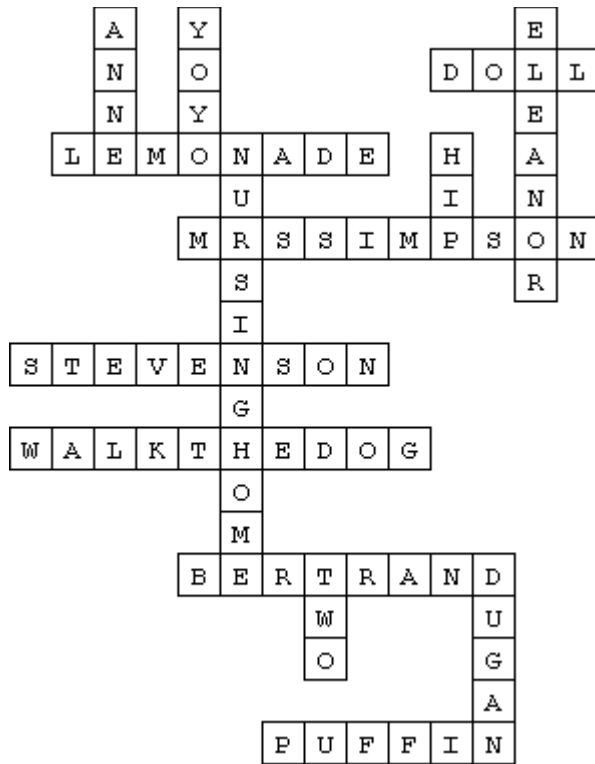
